

Bugs, worms, viruses and Trojan horses Microsoft coming out with guns blazing, finally. But, watch out!

How many times in the past have we discussed the vulnerability to attack of Microsoft Windows operating systems? First it was innocuous bugs that just gave you funny pictures on your screen. Then it was worms that infected your computer and spread to others. These usually did no harm to your computer, but were just a pain to deal with. Now it is worms or backdoor viruses that get into your computer and hijack your home page or slow your connection down until you can no longer get on the Internet. Many people



have recently complained that their home page is gone. It just disappeared and in it's place is "about Blank" with a listing of different sites that they could just click on to. It was hijacked! Where will it go from here?

Well, Microsoft is finally coming out with a major security update, trying to put a stop to these kinds of damaging attacks. (Or at least put a slow to them) While this is definitely the right thing to do to help users of Windows fight these problems, there will surely be major problems because of it. It will be called Security Patch 2 and, while it was originally scheduled to come out in June, it is now scheduled for an August release.

SR2 as it is called, will contain added firewall protection, which will make it harder for an intruder to get into someone else's computer. This function will be automatically turned on and may cause problems for some programs that have been running in Windows for many years. A program that does not match Microsoft's criteria may be dubbed an attacker, and therefore not allowed to launch its program. Software producers are scrambling to make sure their software is compatible with the new Windows firewall. This is where you come in. You may have your favorite software on your machine that has been running for some time with no problems. After you download the SP2, it may not work! Don't panic. Go to the software's website and see what they say about the compatibility with SP2. They will probably have a patch of their own to make it work. Norton, the largest anti-virus software producer has already stated that they will have a patch to make their products compatible. You would think that all Microsoft software will be compatible, however at the time of this writing, there were still problems associated with their own programs. Games and music services will be most vulnerable. After SP2 is installed, users will get messages that a program is trying to access

the Internet, and ask if you want it to proceed. If you recognize the program, say ok. If not... well you get the picture. If you have the Internet Firewall activated on your XP computer now, you should already be accustomed to this. If not, I am sure you will get used to it real quickly.

Outlook Express, Microsoft's email program will also have an attachment manager, which will offer better protection against attacks spread through emails. Emails are the main carrier of problems. Hopefully, this will help.

So, what is a typical computer user to do? My advice is:

- 1.Keep your virus detection program up to date. (Heard that before?) No, Norton 2002 will not do.
- 2. Keep your Windows updates current, until SP2 comes out.
- 3. When SP2 comes out, let it stew a little while before downloading to your machine.. Let's let somebody else figure what will and will not work with it. I am sure Microsoft will come out with many patches for it, just like they did SP1.
- 4. When you do download it and a program does not work, check the manufacturer's website for a possible patch to make it compatible. For those people still on dial-up, the SP2 will take an extremely long time to download. There will be a CD available if you request it.

I think Microsoft is doing its best to make their operating system as safe as possible, however, when they make a change, even something very small, it affects a lot of other things on a computer. This is not a small change. Good luck.

We truly live in an amazing time. What will tomorrow bring?

Tax-Advantaged Ways to Pay for Education

There's little doubt that a good education is one of the keys to personal success. However, with education expenses constantly increasing, and a decrease in the amount of financial aid available, college expenses are more and more becoming a financial burden and, in some cases, may be out of reach.

Given the enormity of this expense, you can't begin to prepare too soon. And thanks to the latest legislation, you have more options from which to choose. Among them are the IRAs (Education, Traditional and Roth-under certain circumstances) and state-sponsored programs. If you didn't qualify for these tax-favored savings vehicles in the past, or if you thought they were too limited to get the job done, take another look:

Section 529 Savings Plans

These state sponsored plans allow you to invest more than ever before in a taxadvantaged program. Any U.S. resident can invest and withdrawals can be used at any eligible post-secondary school in the U.S., including public and private colleges and universities, community colleges and most vocational schools. Qualified withdrawals from any state-sponsored college savings plan or qualified tuition program will be free from federal income taxes until at least December 31, 2010. Congress must extend the law allowing tax-free distributions to

continue after this date. If it isn't, distributions will be taxed at the beneficiary's tax rate. Also, many states extend favorable tax

deductions and tax-free withdrawals to state residents who invest in a home state plan.

State sponsored savings plans also offer a unique opportunity for grandparents and other older relatives to contribute up to \$55,000 (\$110,000 for married couples) per beneficiary in one year without incurring gift taxes. These dollars are considered to be a completed gift, and out of the donor's estate unless the account owner dies within five years of the gift. If that should happen,

a prorated portion of the original contribu-

tion amount only will be included in the

donor's taxable estate.

If you are considering a 529 Savings Plan, you'll be glad to know that The Education Savings Account (ESA) contributions or distributions are permitted even if you contribute to or withdraw from a Section 529 College Savings Plan in the same year. You may also claim a HOPE Scholarship or Lifetime Learning credit in the same year as an ESA or Section 529 College Savings Plan distribution, as long as you claim different expenses.

The Education Savings Account

Beginning in 2002, the maximum annual contribution to an ESA (formerly, the Education IRA) increases to \$2000 per child, for married taxpayers who file a joint tax return and have adjusted gross income (AGI) up to \$190,000. The ability to contribute phases out for salaries between \$190,000 and \$220,000. This is a \$40,000 increase over previous AGI limits.

And there's another plus. In addition to college or graduate school, you can now

use these funds to cover elementary through secondary school expenses as well. So, the ESA could be a smart investment vehicle if you plan to send your children to private grade school or high school. All earnings will be exempt from federal, state and local tax as long as the account is used to pay for qualified expenses. Even If you send your children to a public grade school, you can still use an ESA to save for certain out-of-pocket expenses.

The new tax law allows you to use your tax-free distributions to purchase computer equipment, uniforms and transportation, extended day programs, academic tutoring, books and supplies, in addition to tuition and room and board at public, private or religious schools.

A Word on Traditional & Roth **IRAs**

You can withdraw funds early from a traditional IRA to pay higher education expenses without paying the 10% penalty. The downside is that you will still be liable for any regular income taxes due on the amount withdrawn. So, the Education Savings Account is a better choice.

The benefit of a Roth IRA is that it allows you, if it has been established and funded for five years or more, to withdraw your earnings for educational purposes before the age of 59 ½, penalty-free. Any earnings you take out, again, will be subject to regular income tax.

Before you make any decision on how you will finance your children's, grandchildren's or other relative's education, speak with your tax and financial advisors. They have information and experience that could help you plan for this important event.

Bluebird. Why? I hear some say their hormones are running out. But, just think of having three or four nestings happening month after month, which could give a possible twelve to 20 babies. And they have to keep predators away, find enough food, survive severe weather, and always there is the unrelenting heat! Plus, the young birds slow down breeding, because they are new Moms, and the older Moms are too old to just keep producing.

The Bluebirds will stay around our area all year long. John Barrows of the Ona Bluebird Trail in Hardy County, made the comment that other Bluebirds will come from the Northern areas, and fly among our Bluebirds in the wintertime. You will be seeing Bluebirds in larger flocks of birds, as they fly from property to property looking for new homes for next year.

Many have asked about the Purple Martin, and that they have not seen them around. They come to our area starting in January and leave at least by late June. By the middle of July, they have flown on to the Louisiana area, and meet in the numbers of thousands for their flight to Central America. I just read where Shreveport, LA is a good place to view this gathering.

A Carolina Wren just finished a nest of four fledglings. Over on Rye Rd, Chris, Bob and RJ Gwode's Trail M 23, had a late nesting of them. Along with the Carolina Wren and the Tufted Titmouse will both stay in our area, but are through breeding until next year. The Great Crested Flycatcher which nests one time, came to our area the end of May, and it too is through breeding. Mari Grosse's Trail M 34 off State Rd. 70, should have their woodpecker and it's four babies just finish fledging.

This is not the end, but another great beginning! We have had many new Monitors this year as our Trail numbers grew. I also know there must be many of your who have not joined our Project, which also have boxes you look after. There has been a lot of hands on Bluebird education this year because of so many nestings. Also, so many of the nests have had many birds fledge from them. All that is left now, is the reporting paperwork to be finished. Now is also a great time to make those corrections/repairs to your boxes or Trail.

If you do not have a Trail, now is an excellent time to get ready for next year. Yes! There is only just over 5 months left until breeding season starts again! It will be here just that fast. Think about that. Take out time for Thanksgiving, and Christmas, Halloween, getting ready for school,... well you can see we all stay very busy. If you want Bluebirds, and other cavity nesting birds, you have to stop and make time to fit caring for them into your life. Whether you put up your own boxes, or join our Bluebird Project, those boxes need to be looked after, and you have a responsibility to know what you should do. I would like to help you.

At this end to the season, I am now completing, our almost 800 Bluebird boxes, worth of information to Cornell University. At the time of this writing, we still have 22 boxes with eggs and babies in our immediate area. Monitor Sherry Miller reported starts of new nests on Billie Sunday's M 33 Singletary Rd. Trail. These nests will be complete about the third week of August. I have been working with the older existing Trails on the gathering all of their Trail information, and I am making sure that we all are reporting as to the way Cornell University needs for their Bluebird research.

"Frankly I don't believe people think much about what it takes to be a cowboy..."



I wrote about cowbovs last week and over the years I have often wondered why young fellas ever wanted to be a cowboy in the first place. Before he even starts to work he has to have more than ambition because he has to have the equipment to do it.

The first thing he has to have is a horse and not just any horse, but a horse that will watch a cow and travel, or as the old timers say "walk a hole in the wind." The horse has to load in

trailer, stand tied and have enough speed to catch and turn back a yearling' that breaks loose from the herd and stout enough to carry a full grown man from daylight till dark if the job calls for it.

The price tag for a horse like that, even a green broke, seldom runs under \$2,000 and if he is trained as a ropin' horse as high as \$5,000.

A cowboy also needs a 4wheel drive pickup at (\$22,000 and up) because he will be called to work at ranches where the only way in and out is with an all-terrain type vehicle and I learned a long time ago that applies to veterinarians too. That was the time I also found out cowboys have political convictions too.

I was working at Mabry Carlton's ranch in Sidel vaccinating calves and on the way in my vehicle got stuck in what was usually a muddy road and the cowboys came and pulled me out. Then while we were in the cowpens we got to talking politics and I made the mistake of admitting to a Democratic audience which included Mabry and Jack and a bunch of other cowboys that I was a Republi-

They proceeded to tell me that if I got stuck on the way out they were going to drive off and leave me. Well, of course on the way out I got stuck and I thought they were going to do just that, but they finally came back to pull a Republican veterinarian out of the mud. After that I tried to remember never to discuss politics in the cowpens.

There are always miscellaneous items cowboys need like a slicker that they carry rolled up behind the saddle because eventually the cowboy will get caught six miles from the barn when it starts raining and a slicker would run at least \$75.

The clothes a cowboy wears are specialty items too. A wide brim western hat shades his eyes, his ears and the back of his neck to keep him from getting skin cancer. He has a light weight straw for summer for about \$60 and a heavier felt hat for winter and these run more than \$100.

Most cowboys wear brogans and these work boots cost about \$85. Cowboy boots for rodeos and special occasions run \$200 or more. A pair of Levis or Wranglers if he can find them on sale and a western shirt (with two pockets) will be another 30 bucks.

If you ask a cowboy if he has a knife he is apt to reply "I got my britches on ain't I" and a good knife that will hold an edge to cut calves and mark yearlins' is now \$100 or more.

Then after the cowboy has the experience and accumulates about \$30,000 worth of equipment to be a cowboy he is ready to do a day's work...for \$75 or \$100 a day. Of course if it's too wet, too cold or just "the wrong time of year to work cows) he doesn't work and he doesn't get







CROWLEY MUSEUM & NATURE CENTER



Millions of folks come to Florida to escape the cold weather of the Temperate Zone. But Florida's abundant life in the outdoors can sometimes be overwhelming to the ex-Michigander whose wildlife sightings "up north" have never included alligators, anoles, wood storks, roseate spoonbills, corn snakes, bobcats, and feral pigs.

And along with the plethora of birds, mammals and reptiles, we in Florida are blessed with billions of insects, from tiny nosee'ums to cockroaches the size of Mars bars. While many folks see insects only as something for exterminators in mousemobiles to banish, there is one order of insects that includes some of the most fascinating and beautiful creatures on earth. And that insect order is Lepidoptera, consisting of thousands of species of butterflies, moths

and skippers.

On August 28, Crowley Museum and Nature Center in Sarasota is hosting a Butterfly Walk to let folks get up close and personal with the myriad of local butterflies that call southwest Florida home.

It's going to be a treat for a couple of reasons. The Butterfly Walk will be led by Connie Hodson, owner of Flutterby Gardens in Bradenton. Her company, founded in 1998, not only designs and installs butterfly gardens, but also raises and sells butterflies for release at weddings and other occasions. To

add to her credentials, Ms. Hodson started the Manasota chapter of the North American Butterfly Association. The group's major project was creating the Anna Maria Butterfly Park at Holmes Beach for the public to enjoy. Clearly, she knows her stuff.

When it comes to butterflies, Floridians are luckier than the residents of many other states; our warm climate makes it possible for the little beauties to flutter about year round. In northern climes, butterflies don't get out much in the wintertheir eggs or pupa usually hibernate waiting for the warmth of spring to spread their wings. As a result of our felicitous climate and our rich and varied plant life, Florida has lots of species of butterflies, not to mention the even more prolific and varied moths.Butterfly walkers will benefit from Crowley's varied habitats-including flatwoods, hammock, marsh, swamp and river—which support many of the plants the fussy-eating butterflies depend on for sustenance, both as caterpillars and adults.

Here are descriptions of four of the many kinds of butterflies you might see on the walk:

Zebra Longwing

This is Florida's state butterfly. Easy to spot, it has long black wings with yellow stripes. As a caterpillar, it feeds on passion flowers which provide toxins that make it poisonous to predators as an adult. Once grown, zebra longwings drink only nectar and pollen from plants in the verbena family. This species actually mixes the pollen with a digestive juice before slurping it up—its version of a smoothie. Zebra longwings sleep so soundly that a gentle observer can pick one off its perch, hold it, then replace it without disturbing its slumber.

Viceroy

This butterfly is one you might first mistake for another species. The viceroy has mimicry down to a science, except for the black horizontal stripe on its back wings that differentiate its appearance from the more celebrated monarch. Why mimic? The monarch and viceroy are both toxic and mimic each other to decrease predation. (Naturalists once thought that only the monarch was toxic.) The plentiful Carolina willows throughout the Maple Branch Swamp at Crowley provide food for the viceroy caterpillars.

Zebra Swallowtail

These striking long-tailed beauties have black and white striped wings and red spots on their tails. They are common in South Florida and as caterpillars feed on pawpaw, a common Crowley plant species found in the pine flatwoods. They can have several broods of eggs each year. For some reason the tails of each successive brood are often longer than those of their predecessors. By late in the year, tails of this species can be as long as the overall wings

Cloudless Sulphur

This common Crowley butterfly is one of several sulfur butterflies in Florida and is the most common large sulfur in the state. The cloudless sulfur is almost entirely yellow. It gets its name from the tendency to fly only on sunny, "cloudless" days.

Larval food sources include cassias, partridge pea, and clovers. The adult butterflies are usually seen flying 3 feet above the ground in gardens, beaches, wetlands and open areas where lantana, hibiscus and other good nectar plants can be found.

The Crowley butterfly walk begins at 9:30 am on Saturday August 28. The cost to you? Free, with admission to the Center- just \$5 for adults and \$3 for children ages 5-12. To get there from I-75, exit 210, take Fruit-ville Road east until it ends. Then turn right on Myakka Road and travel 2.5 miles. The entrance to the Center is on the left.

Goodbye for now, but keep your eyes open for news and information regarding our own Myakka





THE NEW MCCC



To meet the MCCC Excecutive Director, Ginki Miller, is to know her love of the Myakka City community and her dream. When my husband and I moved here two years ago, Ginki was among the first to welcome us to Myakka City, and to her impressive future plans for a new community cen-

Looking back, the programs have clearly come a long way since Ginki's early days at MCCC when she built up Camp Myakka at the 'old blue building'* with cement floors and few amenities or resources. What an achievement the groomed park with its kid friendly jungle gyms and basketball court and softball field must have seemed.

But for Ginki it just wasn't enough. And now anyone can see -it clearly isn't enough. Even the greatest of MCCC's

Make-Do-Power can't change a portable that permits only half of the MAC partici-

pants. A cumbersome schedule of rotation of children in and out of the building exists all school year long. And with no viable solution for stormy days – they are left to pray rain and thunder won't start until after 6 pm.

During the summer months when school is out, the Myakka City Elementary School has made space available to accommodate the older Camp Myakka participants. It helps, but now the rotation is even more complicated. The older children have to be bused back and forth, and there is something lost in a community effort that is forced to separate kids geographically by age.

Neither building is large enough for town meetings or the senior's program, so the United Methodist Church has opened its doors to make some room. And a house on the property is rented to MCCC for its Early Learning Center.

You might think MCCC staff would be discouraged from expanding programs – but they continue to find ways. For example, Lois Kersey the SSSP Coordinator saw a need to expand the Super Seniors and Special People program and beginning this summer, a second site at Bethany Baptist has been going strong.


But what a real, seeable difference will be made if we help make Ginki's dream come true. One large center that will bring the entire community together, making it possible for positive interaction between all the programs in a safe and sunny building with more dynamic resources and the development of additional programs such as ongoing adult education and community interest based activities. Wouldn't be something if we had a local workout gym?

Well, it's not really a dream anymore. It's



So with great pleasure, I am writing an ongoing series of articles highlighting MCCC's journey toward *The Building*.

(* The Old Blue Building: For those new to the area, the community center site across from the BP was the original community center, an effort organized by Pastor Larry Albritton and many others. The now mustard yellow building was originally painted blue and funded by local support of community dinners and Turkey Shoots.)

Ginki's Dream: The Goal

Beyond the scope of Turkey Shoots, the estimated costs for the new building are between 1 - 3 million dollars. And while United Way and Manatee County recognize the need and encourage MCCC's efforts – drawing in corporate dollars has not been an easy task. For instance, Eckerd's turned MCCC down in spite of the obvious good cause, because it wouldn't bring them the exposure that funding building projects in larger towns and cities would.

But Ginki, Administrative Director Pepper Sellers and the MCCC Board & Staff say, "Yes it can!"

The area is growing rapidly and envisioning a local supermarket, bank or shopping plaza down the road becomes easier and easier. For MCCC, the new building is no longer an 'if' but 'when'. The goal has been set for 2007 / 2008.

Knowing that plans have to exist on paper to really get a project off the ground, Ginki approached Trey Ness.

Ginki's Dream: The Plans

E.C. Ness III Enterprises, Inc. is the official name of Trey Ness' Drafting Services company, based from his home for the past three and half years here in Myakka City. Trey and his son in law, Craig Prather, draft plans for new construction to pole barns, mostly in Manatee and Sarasota counties

"The growth in the area is just crazy around here now – definitely keeping us busy. People are wanting to move out of the congested areas out to the country," says Trey.

When Ginki approached Trey with her vision, he generously donated his time and expertise to draft working plans for the new MCCC building. For this reason, Ginki asked that I begin the series by interviewing Trey Ness. We met at the Ranch House for lunch and he had a lot to say:

"I'd like to see her dream come true,"

"...we'll all be paid back tenfold..."

said Trey, "I've always lived here. In fact, my two girls had to go to the Y at 59th St. in Bradenton. What a difference it would have made to have similar services here. Now we have a grandson, and we hope he'll benefit from Ginki's dream.

The multi-purpose building will house the early learning center, MAC and other youth programs, the Seniors and include better offices for the Staff. For community meetings and other events – we'll have the space. (The Building) will accommodate several hundred people. And when the rain starts early here, children could now play inside. It would mean everything to be centralized instead of a little here – a little there.

The more the traffic and area grows, this convenience will become a necessity. We could offer so much more... you can't imagine all the ways this can help.

In past years, we had someone come out here to teach gymnastics at the community center. The instructor had to haul all the equipment she could back and forth and hold the classes outdoors. If it rained – there was no class. And for my girls to advance, we had to take them into town."

I asked Trey to describe the planned building's layout, function and design. He replied that I should interview Ginki personally for these details. An obvious good point and we can thank him in advance for my September interview.

Trey pointed out, "The brand new 12,000 sq ft community center on the park property where the portable stands now – right next to the restored Historical Society Schoolhouse – will be a centerpiece of our city.

When you talk about this kind of money – it's easy for us locals to get scared. But if we attend the local fund raisers, we'll all be paid back tenfold. It doesn't matter if you don't have money to donate – don't forget about donating your time. Fundraising efforts need people.

Myakka City needs to get behind this. If only to let your County Commissioners know we want it!"









Where He Got His Nickname

Trey was born and raised in Myakka City. His initials stand for "Earl Clayton" and his nickname Trey came from Aunt "Ludi" Louise. When he was real young, she started calling him 'Trey' as in uno, dos, tres to distinguish him from his father Earl Clayton Jr and his grandfather, the original Earl Clayton Ness.

Trey's Family

Trey's father moved out here to Myakka City when he was 8 or 9, with his mother and brothers, in the early 30s. Most of the family has since stayed in MC.

"Family has always been important to the Nesses. And when you have such a big family, you can't help being that way. For instance, my Mom was 13 out of 14 children. And the only one born in a hospital was the last."

Growing Up in Myakka City

I asked about growing up in Myakka City:

"I went to school in that old school building. We had it good as kids - for the times, but there wasn't any air conditioning.

Each teacher taught 2 grades in every classroom, and I walked home for lunch everyday. They wouldn't let you do that today - or even think about it.

School is still school. But we had some good teachers. Jeanette Albritton taught my Mom, my Dad, my older brother, myself and my younger brother."

Myakka Livin' also wishes their early congratulations to Trey, and his wife, Nancy (Basden) Ness. This December 31st they will celebrate their 25th Wedding Anniversary! Nancy has lived in Myakka City since 4th grade and also attended school in the Myakka City Old Schoolhouse.

LONE SCOUT TRIBE 15

Jim Feiler, who is the local Boy Scout Leader in Myakka City, brought a copy of a copy of a old newspaper clipping of the Lone Scout Tribe 15's cabin and photos to print in our last issue. As it turned out that Trey had the original clipping in a scrap book his mother gave him, we decided to run it for this issue along with the interview.

The originals shown are from the 30s and have since yellowed and faded with age. I worked my digital imaging magic to restore the black and white, some of the tones and to enlarge the tiny images – but of course, there is only so much you can do. The cabin was built by the scouts for their meetings. One of the scouts was Trey's father, E.C. Ness Jr. Years later, Trey's father purchased the cabin and property for his home. Trey grew up in the cabin and over the years it has seen many additions and Trey's mother, June Ness, still lives there today.

Trey believes the cabin was made of logs from cabbage palms, which he said is essentially 'Florida's state tree'.



Our local deputies have brought the law to our attention because they have recently been ask about it by a number of people in our community. They ask our help to inform you about a Class "D" license. Myakka Livin' appreciates this kind of service to our community. Therefore, please read the following.......

Florida Statute 322.54 (d)

"Any person, who drives a truck or a truck tractor having a gross vehicle weight rating, a declared weight, or an actual weight, whichever is greatest, of 8,000 pounds or more but less than 26,001 pounds, or which has a width of more than 80 inches must possess a valid Class D driver's license. Any person who possesses a valid Class D driver's license may, subject to the appropriate restrictions and endorsements, drive any type of motor vehicle, other than the type of motor vehicle for which a Class lass B, or Class C driver's license is required, within this state."

It is only a written test, so stop by your local Division of Driver's License office and pick up a manual. If you want more info get in touch with one of our nice local Deputies as you see them patrol around our neighborhood.
